<u>ข้อเท็จจริง</u>

1.1 ABU ร่วมกับยูเนสโก และ ITU จะจัดการประชุมระดับภูมิภาคว่าด้วยการใช้เทคโนโลยี สารสนเทศเพื่อบริการชุมชน (Serving Communities Through ICTs) ระหว่างวันที่ 26 – 29 กรกฎาคม 2547 ณ กรุงกัวลาลัมเปอร์ ประเทศมาเลเซีย

1.2 การประชุมครั้งนี้มีวัตถุประสงค์เพื่อส่งเสริมให้หน่วยงานวิทยุ-โทรทัศน์สามารถเข้าถึงผู้ชม กลุ่มใหม่ โดยผ่านเครือข่ายอินเทอร์เน็ต และโทรศัพท์เคลื่อนที่ (มือถือ)

The ABU has planned a four day regional convention in Kuala Lumpur on servicing the knowledge based and infotainment needs of the communities in the Asia-Pacific through the modern information and communication technologies (ICTs). The Convention will focus on content, carriage and business strategies for new services to enable broadcasters to access new audiences through Broadband Internet, broadcasting to "mobiles" and the mobile-phone networks. A copy of the Convention preliminary programme and a summary of its session themes are attached for information.

The event is jointly organised by the ABU Technical and Programme Departments on the ABU ICT Forum platform and is supported by the UNESCO and the International Telecommunication Union (ITU). The Convention is open to participation by senior executives from a wide spectrum of disciplines in broadcasting, including from programme production, post production, news and news reporting, website, channel and archive management, production and delivery engineering, and business strategy planning in ABU members, Affiliates and other public service broadcasters.

ABU ICT Forum

The ABU ICT Forum has been constituted as a working party to address usage of the modern ICTs from the broadcasters' perspective and provide guidance to ABU members in developing new products and delivering their services to audiences. Additionally, the Forum will address all aspects of ICT implementation in its studies and will provide a platform for exchange of ICT related information among the ABU members. This is the

UNESCO-ITU-ABU CAUCUS ON ICTs

REGIONAL CONVENTION: SERVICING COMMUNITIES THROUGH ICTs Kuala Lumpur, 26-29 July, 2004

Introduction

The ABU is organising a four day regional convention on servicing the knowledge based and infotainment needs of the communities in the Asia-Pacific through the modern ICTs. The convention, fully supported and run by the ABU ICT Forum, will focus on content and carriage services that need to be provided to enable audiences to develop in the information society.

The convention will focus on how new services can be set up and delivered. The first formal meeting of the ABU ICT Forum will also be held during this period at which the Forum will chart out its activities and organise their implementation. An outline of the Convention programme is attached.

ABU ICT Forum

The ABU ICT Forum has now been constituted as a Working Party to address usage of the modern information and communication technologies (ICTs). The main objective of the Forum is to provide assistance to ABU members in developing new products and delivering their services to audiences using the new ICTs. Additionally, the Forum will address all aspects of ICT implementation in its studies and will provide a platform for exchange of ICT related information among the ABU members. This initiative taken by the ABU is the beginning of an effort to provide a bridge for the ABU members to migrate to the ICT paradigm.

Organisation

The ABU, supported by the UNESCO and the ITU, is organising this integrated Convention on content, carriage and business aspects of delivery of multimedia content through the new ICTs, - Broadband Internet, broadcasting to mobiles and mobile phone networks.

Objectives

The key objective of the Convention is to expose broadcasting content producers in conceptualising new types of services and applications for the new delivery media, to expose delivery engineers to new techniques for delivery of such new services and to enable business strategists to take some informed decisions on venturing into this new area of activity. A long term objective is to assist ABU members in preparing initial plans for providing services using the new media.

Participation

This four-day Convention in Kuala Lumpur is open to participation by senior executives from a wide spectrum of disciplines in broadcasting, including from programme production, post production, news and news reporting, website, channel and archive management, production and delivery engineering, and business strategy planning in ABU members, Affiliates and other public service broadcasters. In particular, members of the ABU ICT Forum are encouraged to participate.

Format

The Convention will have 7 sessions, six of these for 3 hours each. Each of the sessions will address a set of multi-disciplinary ICT issues on Broadband, broadcasting to "mobiles" and delivery over mobile phone networks. The sessions will be held in an interactive manner and the participants will be expected to contribute. A report on content, carriage and business strategies will be prepared by the participants and adopted on the last day. The final session will be devoted to a Round Table Discussion on how traditional broadcasters can provide new products and services on the new delivery media.

Session Themes

Sessions 1 (Day 1- pm) - ICT Concepts; Broadcasting on Broadband

This introductory session will be devoted to an understanding of the new Information and Communication Technologies, and broadcasters' perspective of the ICT field. Broadband Internet will be introduced as a medium of delivery. Later in the day three report drafting groups will set up.

Session 2 (Day 2 – am) - Broadcasting on Broadband

This session will address the content development and production, engineering and business strategy aspects of broadband delivery.

Session 3 (Day 2 - pm) - Broadcasting to "Mobiles" – Concept, Delivery and New Services

This session will address several aspects of broadcasting to "mobiles" - concepts, audiences, receiving devices, DMB delivery and opportunities for new types of services and products.

Session 4 (Day 3 - am) - Broadcasting to Mobiles – Content, Products and Consumers

This session will explore the new genre of multimedia content required for mobiles, address employing archival resources, products, business strategies and will discuss country reports.

Session 5 (Day 3 - pm) - Delivering Broadcasting Products on Mobile Phone Networks

This session will address developments related use of mobile phone networks for multimedia product delivery, characteristics of mobile phone devices, broadcasting products and services, content generation and business strategies.

Session 6 (Day 4 - am) - Content Production and Business Strategies

This session will address the crucial issues of creation of original content, content re-purposing, content management systems, integrated content production systems and Internet-based multimedia production.

Session 7 (Day 4 - pm) - Round Table Discussion

This session will commence with a wrap-up of the Convention and address the topic "How Traditional Broadcasters can provide new Products and Services on the New Delivery Media". All participants will be expected to contribute. At this session, the Convention Report will be introduced and adopted.

Meeting of ABU ICT Forum

The first formal meeting of the ABU ICT Forum will be held in the morning of 26 July, followed by a second meeting on 28 July. Both these meetings will be devoted to organisation of the activities of the Forum.
